Marian University grew out of the dedication and vision of Sister Theresa Hackelmeier and the Sisters of St. Francis, Oldenburg, Indiana, who established a school in Oldenburg, Indiana, in 1851. After a number of transformations, the school became Marian College in 1936. The college moved to Indianapolis in 1937 and classes began on September 15 in Allison Mansion.

On July 1, 2009, Marian College became Marian University. On May 4, 2011, Marian University received pre-accreditation status for a new medical school. On August 24, 2011, the university broke ground on the Michael A. Evans Center for Health Sciences that houses the Marian University College of Osteopathic Medicine and the Leighton School of Nursing. On August 6, 2013, Marian University held a ribbon-cutting ceremony and reception for the Michael A. Evans Center for Health Sciences. The College of Osteopathic Medicine matriculated its first class in August 2013 and held its inaugural commencement ceremony on May 7, 2017.



# **Academic Regalia**

The origin of academic regalia (gowns, hoods, and caps) dates back to the 12th century when universities began to form and most scholars belonged to religious orders. Colors became standardized in the United States in 1895 when a group of leading educators from Ivy League and New York universities (the Intercollegiate Commission) introduced an Academic Costume Code (i.e., colors identify the university and degree and the cut-and-style of the academic attire distinguishes the level of education).

### Gowns

Bachelor's gowns are simple with long, pointed sleeves and no trim. Master's gowns have oblong sleeves which are open at the wrist. Doctoral gowns are the most elaborate with front-facing velvet and three velvet bars on each billowing, bell-shaped sleeve.

#### Hoods

Bachelor regalia may include a hood which is 36 inches in length. Master's and doctoral regalia include hoods that are 42 and 48 inches in length, respectively. Hoods

are lined with silk that indicate the academic color(s) of the institution. A binding trim of velvet designates the subject in which the degree is granted. The color for doctoral degrees in medicine is green; the color was chosen to represent medieval herbs. Royal blue represents the doctoral degree in philosophy (Ph.D.).

#### Caps

Mortarboards are worn at all levels. Recently, tams have increasingly been adopted as the caps worn by doctoral candidates and those with a doctoral degree. Tassels are typically black or the color of the subject studied; gold tassels are worn by doctoral candidates and those with doctoral degrees. When candidates enter the ceremony, their tassels are on the right side of their cap. Graduation is signified symbolically when the tassel is moved to the left.

# **Honorary Degrees**

# Virginia A. Caine, M.D. Commencement Speaker Recipient of Doctor of Public Service

Virginia A. Caine, M.D., is the director of the Marian County Public Health Department and associate professor of medicine at Indiana University School of Medicine, Infectious Diseases Division. She previously served as past president for the American Public Health Association.

Dr. Caine set up the first nationwide physician educational program regarding AIDS for the National Medical Association. She led the process to create Indianapolis' first integrated HIV healthcare delivery system and was principal investigator for the Ryan White Title III funds, which established the first



HIV/AIDS clinics in the major city hospitals, 10 community health centers, and the resource for community-based HIV/AIDS prevention programs. She was also instrumental in reducing the black infant mortality rate to its lowest level ever in the history of Indianapolis.

Dr. Caine is chairman of the board of trustees for the National Medical Association and current chair of the Infectious Diseases Section. Dr. Caine is a board member for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report Editorial Board, chair of the Managed Emergency Surge for Healthcare Coalition, member of the National Biodefense Science Board, co-chair of the Jump In for Healthy Kids Advisory Committee, founding member of the Indiana Health Information Exchange, and board member of the Indiana Latino Institute.

Dr. Caine has earned a national reputation and received many awards for her dedication to improving public health. She was named the National Medical Association's 2010 Practitioner of the Year, and has received the prestigious Sagamore of the Wabash awards from two Indiana governors.

Marian University is pleased to award an honorary doctorate to Dr. Virginia Caine, who has used her gifts and talents to advance public health nationwide.

# **State Representative Tim Brown, M.D.**Recipient of Doctor of Public Health

State Representative Tim Brown, M.D., was elected as a state representative in 1994 and serves House District 41, which includes portions of Montgomery, Boone, and Tippecanoe counties. He has worked on various legislative initiatives, many of which focus on healthcare. He recently retired as an emergency room physician at St. Elizabeth Hospital in Crawfordsville.

State Representative Brown was appointed as chairman of the Public Health Committee and the Statutory Committee on Ethics. He is the chairman for Ways and Means, member of Indiana State Medical Association, board member of the Franklin Methodist Retirement Community, and was the treasurer for the State Medical Association for four years.



State Representative Brown has received several awards for his commitment to serving the community as a legislator and physician including, Outstanding Legislator for Indiana Medical Association, Outstanding Achievement Award for AIDS, and Legislator of the Year by the Indiana Ophthalmology Association in 2005, and Indiana Public Health Association in 2006.

Marian University is pleased to award an honorary doctorate to State Representative Tim Brown for his commitment to advance public health and legislation in the state of Indiana.
