

## Academic Regalia

The origin of academic regalia (gowns, hoods, and caps) dates back to the 12th century when universities began to form and most scholars belonged to religious orders. Colors became standardized in the United States in 1895 when a group of leading educators from Ivy League and New York universities (the Intercollegiate Commission) introduced an Academic Costume Code (i.e., colors identify the university and degree and the cut-and-style of the academic attire distinguishes the level of education).

### Gowns

Bachelor's gowns are simple with long, pointed sleeves and no trim. Master's gowns have oblong sleeves which are open at the wrist. Doctoral gowns are the most elaborate with front-facing velvet and three velvet bars on each billowing, bell-shaped sleeve.

#### Hoods

Bachelor regalia may include a hood which is 36 inches in length. Master's and doctoral regalia include hoods that are 42 and 48 inches in length, respectively. Hoods are

lined with silk that indicate the academic color(s) of the institution. A binding trim of velvet designates the subject in which the degree is granted. The color for doctoral degrees in medicine is green; the color was chosen to represent medieval herbs. Royal blue represents the doctoral degree in philosophy (Ph.D.).

#### Caps

Mortarboards are worn at all levels. Recently, tams have increasingly been adopted as the caps worn by doctoral candidates and those with doctoral degrees. When master and doctoral candidates enter the ceremony, their tassels are on the left side of their cap and they do not move the tassel. When associate and bachelor candidates enter the ceremony, their tassels are on the right side of their cap and graduation is signified symbolic when the tassel is moved to the left.

Marlene Dotson serves as the president and chief executive officer of the Indiana Latino Institute (ILI), a statewide nonprofit organization whose vision is to be the source of authority and catalyst for change

on all aspects of leadership and education for the Indiana Latino community. Under Dotson's leadership, the ILI has expanded its education programs, created the Indiana Latino Leadership Circle, the Indiana Latino Legislative Agenda, the Indiana Higher Education Consortium, the Indiana Latino Education Summit, and secured more than \$17 million in scholarships for Indiana Latino students.

Prior to her time at the ILI, Dotson served as president and chief executive officer of the National Latino Tobacco Control Network, where she provided trainings and assistance to empower Latinos to achieve health equity across the nation. She also spent more than a decade as the immigrant affairs liaison for Indiana's Seventh Congressional and worked closely with the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services, the U.S. Department of the State, and U.S. Embassies around the world. in this position, Dotson became the first Latina to assist a member of the Indiana Congressional Delegation of the United States Congress.

Dotson's list of civic engagements is long and varied. She currently serves on the Indiana Commission for Higher Education Partner Pentagon Collaborative, Indiana Chamber of Commerce/Institute for Workforce Excellence Task Force, Indy Chamber Business Equity for Indy Public Policy Taskforce, United Way Central Indiana Policy Work Group, Indy Chamber Hispanic Business Council, and Ambassador of OXFAM America. She also founded the Indiana Latino Coalition Against Domestic & Sexual Violence. Dotson is proud to have earned her Master of Public Affairs from the School of Public and Environmental Affairs (SPEA) at Indiana University. Her work as been recognized by various organizations and companies such as UNIVISION Television and the Mexican Consulate of Indiana. In early 2023, Dotson was recognized and received one of the Indianapolis *Recorder Newspaper and Indiana Minority Business Magazine's* Champion of Diversity award and received the Chairman's Award at the annual Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday Celebration from the Indiana Civil Rights Commission.

## Joseph T. Doyle, CPA Recipient of Doctor of Philanthropy



Active on the Marian University Board of Trustees from 2005-2022, Joseph Doyle is responsible for helping then-Marian College grow and develop into the thriving university we know and love

today. In honor of his tireless efforts to support Marian University's Finance, Audit, and Mission and Identity Committees with his time, talent, and treasure, Doyle was elected to the distinguished rank of Marian University Emeritus Trustee in the summer of 2022.

Doyle has always said that "Managing change was a theme of my career." Indeed, the retired CPA credits much of his considerable success to his willingness to embrace change. He has moved often and befriended many. After a 17-year stint at Peat Marwick Mitchell (now KPMG), where he rose to partner-in-charge of the audit practice of the Pittsburgh office, Doyle spent eight years as an executive at General Dynamics before joining the Allison Engine Company and later, Westinghouse. Ultimately, he struck out on his own, establishing a private financial consultancy business where he advised, invested in, and directed private businesses. He retired in 2005.

Doyle received his Bachelor of Science in Accounting from the University of Scranton in 1969 and was recognized with the Wall Street Journal Award for Excellence in Accounting. In addition to his many commercial activities, Doyle has served as an emeritus director of the Archdiocese of Washington Center City Consortium of parochial grade schools, as a trustee of the Oakland Catholic High School in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, and as a trustee for Fontbonne College in Clayton, Missouri. He is proud to have played a leadership role in instituting former Archbishop Daniel Buechlein's initiative, Making A Difference, to rebuild eight inner-city parochial schools in Indianapolis and also to have served as the chairman of the Reuse Authority that successfully privatized the Naval Air Warfare Station in Indianapolis for then-Mayor Steve Goldsmith.

Together with his wife, Judy, Doyle remains active in the Order of Malta. The couple has four adult children and seven grandchildren. He previously served as Ascension's president and chief executive officer, after serving as president and chief operating officer and earlier as executive vice president and general counsel. He represented Ascension at Scottsdale Institute and spoke at the 27th Workshop for Bishops by The National Catholic Bioethics Center.

Impicciche earned a juris doctorate from Indiana University School of Law, Indianapolis, and a Master of Healthcare Administration from Indiana University. He received his bachelor's degree from Wabash College, in Crawfordsville, Indiana, where he was a Lilly Scholar.

Impicciche was named one of the Most Influential People in Healthcare by Modern Healthcare from 2019 through 2022. He currently serves on the Boards of the Catholic Health Association of the United States, the American Hospital Association, the Catholic University of America, and the Society of St. Vincent de Paul National Foundation. He served on the Marian University Board of Trustees from 2010-17.
