Claire J. Fiddian-Green serves as president of the Richard M. Fairbanks Foundation, a private foundation whose mission is to advance the vitality of Indianapolis, Indiana, and the well-being of its people.

Prior to her time at the

Richard M. Fairbanks Foundation, Fiddian-Green served as special assistant for education innovation to former Indiana Governor Mike Pence and co-founder of the Center for Education and Career Innovation. She also served as the founding executive director of the Indiana Charter School Board, a statewide charter school authorizing agency. Prior roles include president of The Mind Trust, grants officer for the Richard M. Fairbanks Foundation, and senior analyst within Eli Lilly and Company's Corporate Finance and Investment Banking group.

Fiddian-Green's civic engagements include service on the board and executive committee of the Indy Chamber, where she also chairs the Health Policy Council. She serves on the boards of the Mitch Daniels Leadership Foundation, Central Indiana Corporate Partnership, Regenstrief Institute, and CareerWise USA.

Her work has been recognized by the *Indianapolis Business Journal* (Indiana 250 and Women of Influence) and Community Fairbanks Recovery Center (Circle of Hope Award).

John Ernest Giles

Recipient of Doctor of Business Administration



John Giles serves as chairman of American Commercial Barge Lines (ACBL). Headquartered in Jeffersonville, Indiana, ACBL is the second largest operator on the inland waterways, with 2,500 employees. Giles' mission

is to help guide the company since it emerged from bankruptcy in 2020, building upon the organization's recent unprecedented profitability, ultimately positioning the company for long-term, sustainable growth and success.

Born in Coventry, England, and immigrating to Indianapolis with his family in 1957, Giles feels fortunate to have been educated at local Catholic schools including St. Philip Neri Catholic School, The Latin School of Indianapolis, and Marian College. While studying at Marian College and seeking a "high paying" job, Giles' friend John Yanney '70 mentioned that he had an "in" with the local supervision on the B&O Railroad. That conversation turned into a summer job on the railroad, and ultimately evolved into a 50+ year career in the transportation industry.

Prior to his time at ACBL, Giles developed a keen interest in "underperforming" companies and what it took to turn them around. He served as chief executive officer of four different organizations: Great Lakes Transportation, RailAmerica, Inc., Florida East Coast Railway, and the Central Maine and Québec Railway Company. Under the leadership of Giles and his team, each company enjoyed dramatic improvements in safety, profitability, and sustainability. Most importantly, his efforts not only preserved, but created, many essential jobs for the many communities in which he served.

Giles' successful track record of building teams and turning around floundering organizations has earned him the reputation as one of the foremost operational experts in the transportation industry, specifically in freight railroads. He has had success in publicly traded companies and for private equity partners Blackstone Capital and Fortress Investment Group.

Giles is proud to have received his Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from Marian College in 1972 and his Master of Science in Business Analytics from Indiana University in 1980.

Prior to his career at Marian, Inc., Witchger worked as a district executive for the Boy Scouts of America.

Witchger's civic engagements over the years have included leadership service for Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School, Catholic Community Foundation, Providence Cristo Rey High School, The Athenaeum Foundation, and The Rotary Foundation, among others.

His work has been recognized with the Sister Jeanne Hagelskamp Award from Providence Christo Rey High School and the President's Award from Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School.
